TOTH 2014. Final programme

The forthcoming edition of the international conference *Terminology & Ontology: Theories and applications* (TOTH) will be held at the University of Savoie on 12th and 13th June 2014, in Chambéry (France). The TOTH conferences aim to bridge the gap between terminology and ontology by highlighting the contributions that the one makes to the other and by opening up new perspectives for both theoretical and practical developments. A one-and-a-half day training session takes place before the conference on 10th and 11th June, focused this year on text analysis for onomasiological purposes.

Translating Europe Forum (DGT)

DGT organizes the 1st Translating Europe Forum, on **18th and 19th September 2014** in Brussels.

DGT wants to establish a more structured cooperation with its stakeholders, to create a community of interest, with a view to giving visibility to the world of translation, exchanging good practices, developing common projects and promoting a diversified and sustainable market for professional translators in Europe.

The aim of this conference is to bring together stakeholders (universities, providers and buyers of translation services, public institutions, private companies) to discuss translation-related matters and facilitate the development of concrete projects.

The first day will be dedicated to three topics: *Innovation in the Translation Sector* and *EU initiatives and Funding Opportunities in the Translation Sector* and *Bridging the Skills Gap*. The second day will be dedicated to *Translation and Intellectual Property Rights* and a Round Table on Ideas for the future of the Forum.

6. Textile terminology conference in Copenhagen June 2014



TERMCAT publishes a dictionary on electoral terminology

The *Terminologia electoral bàsica* ('Basic Electoral Terminology') defines 125 terms related to election processes and electoral systems. Each entry offers the denominations and definition in Catalan and the equivalents in Spanish, French and English. Some terms also provide conceptual notes.

TERMCAT has produced this dictionary in collaboration with the Catalan Government's Ministry of Governance and Institutional Relations. The Spanish-Language Department of the Directorate-General for Translation at the European Commission also took part in the project and provided TERMCAT with bibliographical references.
