EAFT Summit in Barcelona. November, 2014

EAFT, in collaboration with TERMCAT, is organizing the Seventh Terminology Summit in Barcelona on November 27-28, 2014.

The overall topic for the summit is: How does social networking affect terminology work? In recent years social networks have burst into life, and into our work lives, too. Terminology work and its dissemination are no exception. This is why we have thought it would be interesting for the international terminology community to open a debate about the impact of social media on all spheres of terminology work, from research all the way through to dissemination.

The Summit is organized under the patronage of the Department of Culture of the Government of Catalonia, the Délégation générale à la langue française et aux langues de la France (DGLFLF) and SCATERM.

The Conference will take place at the EAFIT University on 13-14 November 2014 in Medellín, Colombia. Best practices in research and applications will be at the core of the seminar.



Book Reviews

Two books about terminology in the Irish language have recently been published by the Irish-language publisher, Cois Life, and will be launched in Dublin on October 2nd.

Ár dtéarmaí féin [Our own terms]

By Fidelma Ní Ghallchobhair from the Irish Terminology Committee gives a historical overview on patterns of term- and word- formation from the Old Irish period (AD 6th - 9th centuries) to the present day. A table of cognates across Indo-European languages shows how many far-flung languages share words with Irish, and the close correspondence of many Irish words to words in many European languages is highlighted through tables of loanwords from Latin into contemporary Romance languages, Old Norse into the Nordic languages today, Anglo-Norman French, and English. This overview is couched in an overview of the history and development of the language and literature from 4th-19th centuries, which is, in turn, couched in an overview of Irish history over the same period, in order to show how historical events affect language. A chapter on the history and development of English is included, by comparison, to show how historical events affected the English language. The book is in the form of a textbook and includes some theory as introductory material for students. Some chapters are devoted to everyday practical terminology work: term-formation methods, harmonization and standardization, and terminography.



Téarmaíocht Ghaeilge na hAthbheochana [Irish terminology during the Revival Period (1880-1927)]

By Conchúr Mag Eacháin, focuses on the condition of Irish terminology during that period (when the language had reached its lowest ebb) and presents the debates and arguments published in newspapers and journals by prominent writers, academics and revivalists as to how to develop modern terminology, ranging from adherence to native elements to borrowing international terms.



Termcraft: The Emergence of Terminology Science from the Vinčans and Sumerians to Aristotle

In June 2014 FriesenPress released a landmark monograph investigating the connections between writing, ancient beliefs, linguistics, and philosophy; it is expected to draw interest from professors and students of anthropology, religion, languages and translation, and philosophy.
